He has written fourteen books including **I Don't Know What To Say - How To Help And Support Someone Who Is Dying (1988)** a guide for friends and family, **Magic or Medicine?** an investigation into complementary medicine and **What You Really Need To Know About Cancer**, a comprehensive guide for patients and their families, which has been published in Britain, Canada, the United States (in collaboration with the M.D.Anderson Cancer Center).
